## YMCA PROJECT UPDATE

It's only a matter of months before the new YMCA opens on Harrisburg Avenue, between the Lancaster Arts Hotel and Clipper Magazine Stadium. The three-story, 42,000-square-foot building is scheduled to open in late summer or early fall, said Beth Grossman, YMCA's financial development director.

The new building is two and a half blocks from the YMCA's current Queen Street head-
